

Child Safety Standards

Standards against child sexual abuse and exploitation (CSAE)

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UNOAH is a faith-based platform for adults and is committed to the safety of children everywhere. We have **zero tolerance** for child sexual abuse and exploitation (CSAE) and for child sexual abuse material (CSAM). This page sets out our standards and the actions we take to prevent, detect, and respond to such conduct, in line with Google Play's Child Safety Standards policy and applicable law.

1. Our commitment

- We prohibit any content, conduct, or use of our Service that sexually exploits, abuses, or endangers children.
- We prohibit the creation, upload, storage, solicitation, or sharing of CSAM through our Service, including any AI-generated material that depicts the sexual abuse or exploitation of minors.
- We prohibit grooming, sextortion, trafficking, and any other form of child endangerment.

2. Age restriction

UNOAH is intended for users aged **18 and over**. We treat any user under 18 as a child and do not knowingly process a child's personal data without verifiable parental or guardian consent. The app is not directed to children and does not contain child-targeted content. See our Privacy Policy and Terms & Conditions.

3. Prevention and detection

- Age eligibility (18+) is a condition of using the Service.
- Our AI features are configured with safety filtering designed to refuse and block sexual content involving minors.
- Any content that violates these standards may be reviewed, removed, and reported, and the responsible account suspended or terminated.

4. Reporting CSAE

Anyone can report suspected CSAE, CSAM, or child endangerment related to our Service. We review reports promptly and take appropriate action, including removal and referral to authorities.

5. Compliance and reporting to authorities

We comply with applicable child-protection laws in the jurisdictions in which we operate. Where we become aware of apparent CSAM or child endangerment, we act in accordance with legal requirements, which may include preserving relevant information and reporting to the appropriate authorities and recognised bodies (for example, the U.S. National Center for Missing & Exploited Children (NCMEC) and/or local law enforcement), as required or permitted by law.
